## ST. JOHN'S LUTHERAN CHURCH'S "MIDLAND MISSION '06" WORK PROJECT

President Elect Brian introduced Deb Stark and Rev. Doug Janetzke from St. John's Lutheran Church who explained the "Midland Mission '06" work project scheduled for June 18-24<sup>th</sup> this summer. Deb said the project will use 100 youth and 25 adults plus a host of additional volunteers to perform needed renovation and repairs on 15 Midland homes where the owners are physically and economically unable to do it. Expenses (including lodging at Northwood for participants) are estimated to be \$44,000. Current funding is estimated at \$36,500, leaving a balance needed of \$7,500. Volunteers are needed and welcome to perform a variety of tasks, including painting, roofing, insulation, plumbing, and general construction.
