MIDLAND COUNTY 4-H PROGRAM

Mike McNulty, representing Junior Youth, introduced Dave Thomas, who is a Youth Educator for Michigan State University Extension. Dave is located in Midland and administers and coordinates the Midland County 4-H program. (The “4-H” stands for Head, Heart, Hands, and Health). 4-H is an educational program for youth that encourages development in knowledge, skill, citizenship, and leadership. It is one of four main programs offered by MSU Extension, and it is supported by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Michigan State University, and the Midland County Government. 4-H serves children and youth ages 5-19. Programs are available in the city of Midland and in all areas of Midland County. Members belong to local clubs (there are about 35 clubs in Midland County) and participate in a wide variety of activities. Dave presented a power point program that Midland County 4-H members have participated in during the past year. One was a three day “Exploration Days” convention at Michigan State University in Lansing, attended by 2500 youth. Midland County had the third largest contingent. Members perform many community service projects and, of course, are always visible at the County Fair. Other opportunities available to members include trips to New York, Washington, and the Annual 4-H Convention in Atlanta as well as international programs and college scholarships.
