#### **PROGRAM, COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Community Services Dick Jellum reported for this key committee which supported CROP Walk, Walk for Warmth, Coleman Christmas Party, Camp Fish Tales, Toni & Trish, Red Cross with donations plus Day of Caring, Pinecrest, Midland Blooms, Adopt A Highway with loving labor..

Fund Raising Al Klasha encouraged members to work harder at supporting our three key fund raising efforts: Nuts (Rajewski/Burmester), T&A (Higgins/Woodward), Golf Tournament (Yates). The programs raised, respectively, \$9,100, \$9,000, and \$5,100 to support our many community contributions. Great Job!

Human & Spiritual Values. Ginnie Morrison said the main hands on activities are the prayer breakfast and lining up people for the weekly invocations. They contributed money to ROCK, WUGN Family Life Radio, MPS International Baccalaureate Program, Food Pantry, Toni & Trish. Ginnie is seeking a co-chair for the committee for the coming year.

Junior Youth. Jim Schroeder. This committee supports kids from elementary through high school ages. New programs adopted this year were Bike Camp for handicapped children and 4-H Midland County.
