JAN LAMPMAN REVIEWS PROGRAMS SPONSORED BY ARC OF MIDLAND

Mike McNulty, in behalf of the Junior Youth Committee, introduced Jan Lampman who is the Executive Director of the ARC OF MIDLAND. The ARC is an organization that works with people of all ages that have developmental disabilities. Their goal is to help people with disabilities to live independently as contributing members to the community. Jan first talked about their program "Growing Up Independent" for children, which is a wide ranging program that emphasizes education but also includes the importance for children to socialize and learn from each other. It also included a "Bike Camp", which was held two years ago and is scheduled again for this summer. This program successfully teaches disabled kids to ride bikes. Jan also mentioned that they used twelve youngsters from the Juvenile Care Center to help, which was a very positive transformational experience for them as well. The "Count Me In" program utilizes 500 volunteers to teach Midland school children about kids with disabilities. The "Project Life Saver" program is a partnership between ARC, Senior Services, and Midland law enforcement agencies to provide an ankle or wrist device to children with autism or adults with dementia, so they can be located if they wander off or become lost. The "Personal Services" program helps adults with developmental disabilities to manage their financial and health affairs, and to live independently. ARC is also heavily involved in the Annual Special Olympics program. Volunteers are always needed to help with these programs. The "Count Me In" and "Personal Services" programs, currently, probably have the greatest need for more volunteers. Jan thanked Kiwassee Kiwanis for our continued support in making Midland a leader in allowing people with developmental disabilities to live independent lives.
