CAROL RUMBA KICKS OFF 2009 CROP HUNGER WALK

Carol Rumba, Co-Chair for the 2009 Midland CROP HUNGER WALK, announced that the event this year will be on Sunday, October 4. This important fund raising program was started in 1946 by Church World United, and has been gaining momentum for 63 years. The need, however, is greater than ever. There are an estimated 923 million people in the world that are suffering from hunger—to the extent that it has a significant effect on their health. This is greater, Carol said, than the total number of people that live in the entire western hemisphere. A child dies from hunger every five seconds. The Midland CROP HUNGER WALK generated \$46,564 last year, with Kiwassee members contributing \$1,820. Dow High Key Club gave \$1,483 with Midland High Key Club (their first year) contributing \$589. The goal for the Midland CROP HUNGER WALK this year is \$50,000. Kiwassee Kiwanis also contributes money to cover administrative costs for the event. Joe Downey has volunteered to be the “recruiter” for the club this year, and will enlist walkers as well as contributions from members. Also, volunteers will be needed to help administer the event. Carol thanked members for their past support.
