ANNOUNCEMENTS AND PRESENTATIONS

***Joe Downey reminded members that the CROP WALK is only a couple of weeks away (October 4). Members can contribute using envelopes on each table, and sign up sheets are available if you want to join the walk.

***Vicki Briggs presented the Scrapbook to Jim Schroeder that was prepared during his time as Club President in 2004-2005.

***Duane Townley said that volunteers are still needed for the Eagle Village work project scheduled for October 2, 3, 9, and 10. Cars will leave the MCFTA parking lot at 8:30 a.m. and return about 5:30 p.m.. Primary work project will be painting cabins.

***Duane Townley presented a check for \$250 to Bob Spears who is a member of the Eagle Village Board of Directors. Bob thanked Kiwanis for our continued support of Eagle Village, which is currently in need of financial support. Bob gave some compelling examples of how this organization helps children and youth that have been victims of abuse and neglect.

***Diane Stevens presented a check for \$400 to Holly Barth from the Midland County Health Dept. Holly thanked Kiwassee and said the donation will be used for a baby shower and educational support for new mothers. Diane also presented a check for \$400 to Karen Adams from Safe and Sound. Karen thanked the club, and said the money will be used to purchase car seats and booster seats for young children.

Young Children Priority One: Co-Chairs Diane Stevens and Penny Ecarius reported that the goal of YCPO is to meet the needs of children from birth to age five in the Midland community. YCPO provided financial support to 22 community agencies during the year from their budget of \$6,700, in addition to several "sweat equity" projects.

Community Service: Sam Choo led the report for Chair Roger Briggs. Sam called all committee members forward, and each reported on their favorite project—including Midland Blooms, Highway Pickup, Tall In The Saddle, Pinecrest support, Eagle Village, Camp Fish Tales, and many others.
