**YOUTH SERVICES AVAILABLE AT THE GRACE A. DOW MEMORIAL LIBRARY**

George Fromhold, chair of the Human and Spiritual Values committee, introduced Stephanie Williams who is the Supervisor of Youth Services at Midland's Grace A. Dow Memorial Library. Stephanie said our Library offers a wide variety of special services for children and youth, including the following programs: (1) Seasonal Events, (2) Teens, (3) Outreach, (4) Story Time, and (5) Book Discussion. The Seasonal Events programs include the annual "Battle of the Books" program (which is a well known institution in Midland), summer programs, summer and holiday movies, "Free Comic Book Day", and others. Teens programs include "Teen Game Days", "Cram Nights", and programs that help teens to find interesting and educational books to read. Outreach programs include "Family Literacy Night", "Community Baby Shower", "Great Start Readiness" (which is sponsored by Success by 6), "Picture Report", and an advanced and accelerated group. Story Time programs are very important, and are designed to help introduce children to books and to reading. They also are designed to educate parents on the importance of reading to children. They help create life time learners and library users. These programs include 2 sessions/week for babies, 2 sessions/week for toddlers, 3-5 sessions/week for 2-3 year old children, and 2 sessions/week for children over 4. The Book Discussion programs include the "Brown Bag Book Club" for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders that meet each month from June through March (they bring their own dinner and discuss books). The "Plot and Pizza Group" for 6<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> graders discuss books and enjoy pizza provided by the Library. These are great programs (all free of charge), and Midland is indeed very fortunate to have the Grace A. Dow Memorial Library. Mike Merrill commented that he knows of no other community that has anything close to this.
