John Johnson has worked with youth for many years. He is currently the director of Rock the Island, an annual Christian event that will take place this year July 22 from noon to 8 p.m., on Ojibway Island in Saginaw. Rock the Island is more than the concert that will feature Newsboys, Love and the Outcome, and Tedashii. The day-long extravaganza has activities for people and families of all ages, including activities teens, tweens, and youngsters will enjoy--inflatables, disc golf, rock climbing, art projects, and more; service opportunities such as weaving mats for the homeless, donating blood to raise funds for the in-school program Rock the Schools, and writing messages to members of the military.
