### COMMITTEE REPORTS, LOOKING FORWARD, 2018-2019

**Club Meetings, Ron Graunke,** will continue to do their behind-the-scene work for meetings.

**Fundraising, Dave Winegardner,** projects are Golf Outing, Midland Waves, and Candy and Nut Sale. Total goal for 2018-2019 is \$31,000+. Some golf outing goals: increase member participation, add teams, continue to promote Kiwassee name with flag display and publicity, maintain the Snow Snake and sponsor relationships. Candy & Nut goals: \$26,000 sales target, maintain sales. Have lost many sellers from the club lately. Flag Committee goals: increase sponsorships by 20%, create a sponsorship sales force.
